NGOs often take a service provider role to provide the necessary protection and support for GBV survivors. In order to push the responsibility taking and accountability of the governments for SGBV response, service delivering NGOs also have to engage in awareness raising, capacity building and advocacy and lobbying work. We will discuss the challenges of such a multifaceted role of NGOs and analyse possible support mechanisms that can secure and strengthen their role and influence on the different levels.
