




Graft cloud over child, maternal care scheme

CONCERN Not even 1% of what the govt had promised is available at ground zero

PAINE: The much-touted health mitiatives launched by the government for maternal and child care sounded hollow on Monday, when around 150 marginaised women from different parts of the state cited specific cases, pointing not only to gaps in implementation of health schemes, but also reeking of corruntion.

The public hearing organised by World Vision India, an international NGO, as part of its Chall Health Now campaign, was an eye-opener when women, mostly Dalits and from minority community said, that not even one per cent of what the government, land promised was available at ground zero.

Kamni Devi, who had com from Begusaral, said that sh had not got 7,400 for institutional delivery under the Janan Bal Suraksha Yojana as official at the health eentre where sh delivered a baby last year sai the hospital did not have cheque book. She also alleges that she had to pay 2300 for th

ambulance service, which was meant to be free, to ferry her from home to the hospital for

Anita Kumar of Nalandi. alleged, that the PHC she visit ed did not have a blood pressure measuring instrument and ever the weighing machine was fault; She also alleged, that she had to pay the auxiliary nursing mid wife (ANM) as well as the government hospital nurses befor the delivery.

Gorki Devi of Gounpura villace. Phulwarisharif, said that

she had to pay ₹200 for her child's vaccination, which was meant to be free at a government health centre in her village. She said the health worker who came after the delivery

Even the 71400 she had got for institutional delivery was spent on medicines and the remaining shared among the accredited social health activist (ASHA), the ANM, nurse and There were many other complaints, including those of Gardi Deck Rinkil Deck Salamari Devi (all from Khaspur panchayat, Maner) and Vidya Devi (vidyapati Nagur Simri block, Samastipur) where medicines were not provided at government bospitals and had to be bought from outside at the time of delivery. These medicines were then shared among different patients. Many also alleged, that the patients were discriminated on caste lines; the ASHA would demand money for home visits; money for institutional delivery had not been pald; besides cases of government doctors encouraging patients with complicated cases to go to private practicioners.

Campaign manager Bult Sareen said that she was shocked to know that 40 chil dren of 60 women had died in the last three years in Armp vil lage of Bikmin, just about 25 km to the west of Patna.
