Why this topic for IAMANEH?

- Claim for engaging men and boys in development work in order to achieve sustainable results and improve impact (GBV-interventions) coming from the field
- 2 positions: neglect of men's needs and growing vulnerability of masculinity <=> danger of loosing attention and resources for women's issues
- Interest for theory as well as lessons learned in the field
- Identification of key areas of concern

Overall goal remains gender equality and reduction of GBV! But:

Men need to have an active stand for changing gender roles and against violence





Theoretical frame: Shift in gender concepts in development

- "Technical Cooperation": men as main addressors of development aid
- 1970's and 1980's: unprecedented focus on women (UN decade for Women) WID
- 1980': emergence of empowerment approach (increased participation of women in political and economic life)
- 1980's 1990's: conceptual shift from Women in Dvpt (WID) to Gender and Dvpt (GAD), including men and boys as well as idea of "gender mainstreaming"
- 1990's onward: Engaging Men and Boys and gendertransformative approaches as new concepts in gender work



Why work with men?

- Empowerment of women has significant impact on men and their social positions and livelihoods. This threatens male selfconceptions and can produce counter-reactions in terms of opposition as well as attempts for greater control and domination over women.
- In the globalized and conflict-torn world, men and women are both exposed to various forms of exclusion, subordination and disempowerment. Men have been identified as gatekeepers for women's empowerment, but at the same time changes in male roles and positions in society show their own manifold marginalization and vulnerabilities.
- A high percentage of violent men have been exposed to different forms of violence during their childhood. This bears a high risk of developing violent behaviors in adulthood.

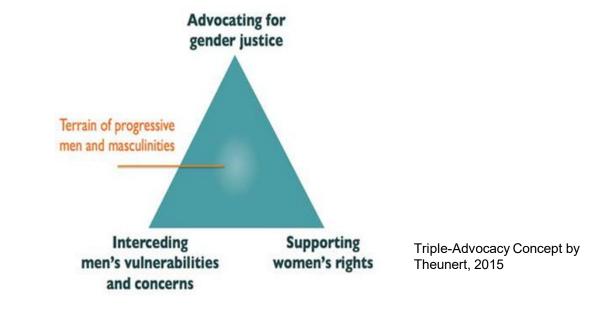
Empowerment as elementary starting point for durable changes in gender relations

Triple Accountability



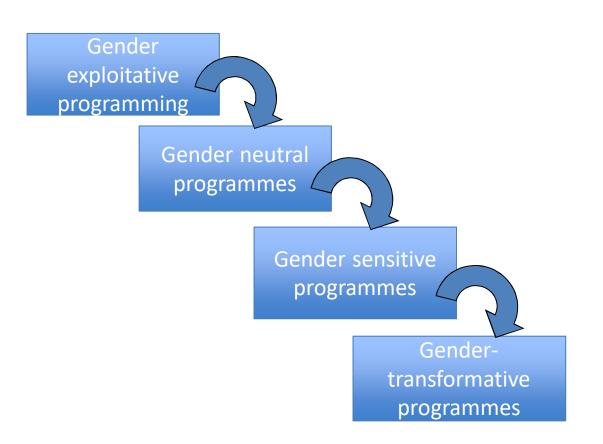
Men as:

The Gender Programming Continuum



Engagement for gender equality calls for gendertransformative action where a **re-definition** of gender roles and values needs to take place and that can't be addressed without a conciouss redistribution of power between the sexes and in a broader societal context. (UNFPA 2013)

Key lessons learned from the field



- Positive impact and visible change on individual and household level: reduced violence, enhanced communication on family level, increased participation in decision-making of women, re-distribution of tasks on household level
- But: still no changed perception of privilege of dominant position of men on society level (longer process)
- Work on level of institutions and authorities confronted with deeply anchored patriarchal norms and values on structural level: need for targeted work with leaders and institutions
- Gender-synchronised action that incorporates mixed and unisex gender-transformative work produces highest effects.



Reflections and processes at organisational level

- Organisational learning and self-reflection for gendertransformative work
- Develop gender-transformative thinking with partner organisations
- Create space for sharing good practice, dealing with insecurities and obstacles, systematization of applied approaches
- Contextual analysis of cultural barriers and opportunities for gender-transformative work
- Re-thinking organisational practice
- Balancing engagement for women and for men
